Haywood was a proud member of the United States Army from 1979 until 1983, receiving his basic training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and was later stationed at Fort Stewart, Georgia. He received an army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Marksman Badge, First Class (Hand Grenade) Badge, and Good Conduct Medal and a host of other ribbons and badges. Haywood entered into eternal rest on Monday, February 21, 2022.
