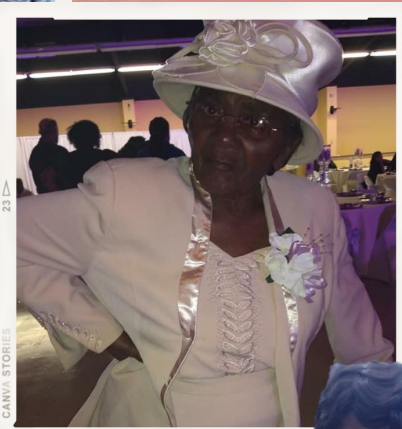
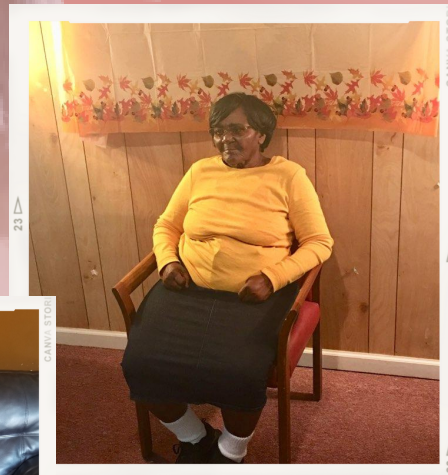
Mother Ella Mae was united in Holy Matrimony on December 25, 1948 to Mr. Linton Rose.
