Mary Ann answered her peaceful call from God on Saturday, August 6, 2022 at Dillon Hospice House.

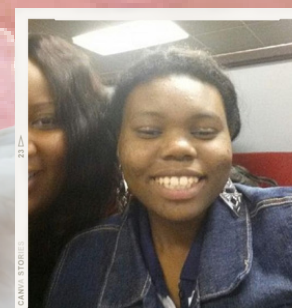
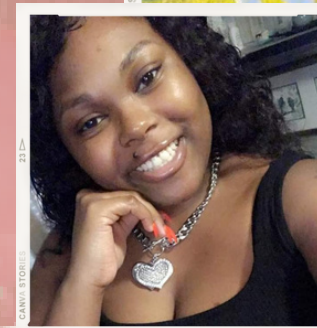
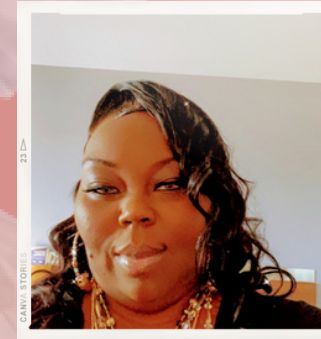
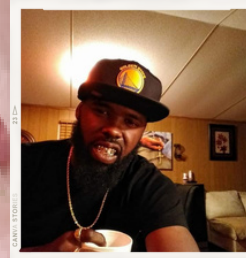
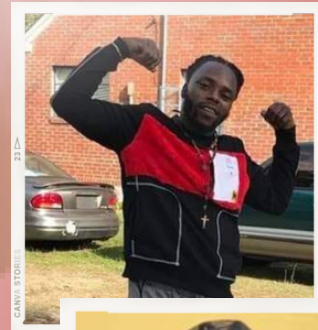
Mary Ann was with the graduating Class of 1977 at Lake View High. She was a cheerleader and she loved to dance.
